



ATIXA Implementing Title IX in the Health Professions Seminar Agenda

Description:

The ATIXA Title IX for the Health Professions Best Practices Seminar is designed for Title IX Coordinators and administrators working in health professions settings (e.g., technical schools, colleges, universities, clinical programs, hospitals).

ATIXA's expert faculty members will address the distinct areas of complexity in multi-jurisdictional healthcare settings and industry standards for Title IX compliance in healthcare education. The workshop will address determining jurisdiction, the obligation to respond, and collaborating with partners to respond to reports or complaints. Seminar faculty will incorporate realistic scenario examples and case studies to allow participants to practice applying their knowledge.

Participants should have either attended ATIXA's Title IX Coordinator Level One: Sexual Harassment course or have pre-existing knowledge of the concepts taught in that course prior to the start of this seminar.

- Explain Title IX's jurisdictional requirements
- Discuss the jurisdictional complexities and obligations to respond in multi-jurisdictional settings
- Manage overlapping policies and procedures between the recipient and a clinical placement site, especially when both may be subject to Title IX
- Identify special considerations for health profession education and Title IX compliance
