

Title IX Coordinator Foundations Level One: Compliance Essentials for K-12 Education Training & Certification Course Agenda

Description:

Title IX Coordinator Foundations Level One: Compliance Essentials for K-12 Education introduces practitioners to Title IX's core tenets for addressing sex discrimination and sexual harassment within the school or district's education program and activities. This one-day course provides Title IX leaders, including K-12 Title IX Coordinators and school/district leaders, with a solid foundation in key aspects of Title IX compliance, focusing on the 2020 Title IX regulatory requirements. Combined with K-12 Fundamentals, the online asynchronous pre-learning, this course fulfills the training requirements for K-12 Title IX Coordinators and Deputy Coordinators.

ATIXA's expert faculty members will discuss the scope of Title IX; core elements of the federal regulations, key compliance requirements for schools and districts, a brief overview of the Title IX Grievance Process, mandated reporting responsibilities for all school and district staff, the intersection of Title IX and ADA/504 and IDEA, non-consensual intimate imagery, athletic programs, and First Amendment implications.

This course's design allows Title IX Coordinators and Deputy Coordinators to then progress into Title IX Coordinator Foundations Level Two: Notice, Initial Assessment, and Resolution Process for K-12 Education, which provides in-depth treatment of specific responsibilities related to the Title IX Grievance Process.
