

Responding to Stalking and Intimate Partner Violence in Education Workshop Agenda

Description:

The Responding to Stalking and Intimate Partner Violence (IPV)Workshop provides Title IX practitioners with an in-depth exploration of these complex issues in education environments, including how they impact employees. ATIXA's expert faculty will review applicable definitions and response requirements under both the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and Title IX.

This workshop covers: stalking and cyberstalking, the broad spectrum and impact of IPV behaviors, barriers to reporting, response options, and safety planning for the affected party. Faculty will address situations in which the Title IX Coordinator believes there is a need to move forward with the Title IX Grievance Process, despite an affected party's wishes, and the complexities of counter-complaints and retaliation. Participants will also explore the intersection of Title IX and Behavioral Intervention Team in higher education or Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management team in K-12, work as it relates to risk assessment and response to stalking and IPV allegations.

- Define stalking and intimate partner violence
- Distinguish between lurking and stalking behaviors and appropriate responses to each
- Identify stalking and intimate partner violence behaviors and patterns

- Identify opportunities to partner with a behavioral intervention team or behavioral threat assessment and management team to assess levels of violence risk
- Discuss the role of the Title IX Coordinator in determining to move forward with IPV investigations
- Analyze issues of retaliation, force, and self-defense in IPV cases
