

RESOLUTION AGREEMENT

Sapulpa Public Library
OCR Complaint No. 07254002

Sapulpa Public Library (the Library) has voluntarily entered into this agreement to resolve the allegations in the above-referenced complaint filed under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Title II), 42 U.S.C. §§ 12131 et seq., and its implementing regulation at 28 C.F.R. Part 35. The Library agreed to resolve this complaint prior to the completion of OCR's investigation pursuant to Section 302 of OCR's Case Processing Manual.

The Library assures that it will take the following actions:

Action Item 1: Parking Accessibility

By November 30, 2026, the Library will make parking spaces accessible to disabled persons in conformity with the 2010 American with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design by (1) replacing the pavement of the spaces, (2) adding pavement markings to the disabled stall areas, including access aisles, (3) replacing concrete sidewalks to comply with slope requirements, (4) installing signage for the spaces, (5) installing curb ramps, (6) placing the outfall downspout for the building through the sidewalk, and (7) painting a crosswalk to the front entrance of the library.

REPORTING REQUIREMENT:

By December 30, 2026, the Library will provide OCR documentation indicating completion of the accessible parking plan, a description of changes made to the site, the date the work was completed, photographs showing the accessible parking, and a written certification from a licensed architect attesting that the parking alterations and updates have been completed in conformity with the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design.

By signing the resolution agreement, the Library agrees to provide data and other information in a timely manner in accordance with the reporting requirements of the resolution agreement. During the monitoring of the resolution agreement, if necessary, OCR may visit the Library, interview staff and students, and request such additional reports or data as are necessary for OCR to determine whether the recipient has fulfilled the terms of the resolution agreement. The Library understands that OCR will not close the monitoring of the agreement until such time as OCR determines that the Library is in compliance with the terms of the agreement and the statute(s) and regulation(s) at issue in the case.

The Library understands that OCR may initiate administrative enforcement proceedings or refer the case to the Department of Justice (DOJ) for judicial proceedings in the event of breach. Before initiating such proceedings, OCR will give the Library written notice of the alleged breach and 60 calendar days to cure the alleged breach.

The Agreement will become effective immediately upon the signature of the Library's representative below.
